10.30 – 12.00 Walk the Walls

Bargate map reference C4

Take a tour of the medieval town walls – simply follow the signs (“Walk the Walls” feet and information panels). Southampton has some of the best preserved town walls in the UK and about half of the one mile circuit still survives. Many of the towers and gates are still standing, including the famous Bargate. This is a good point from which to start your walk – it is one of the finest town gateways in the UK. The first floor of Southampton’s Bargate is now home to a gallery featuring modern art. This is open to the public free of charge when there are exhibitions. During the times when exhibitions are being changed over the gallery will be closed. Please note that there is no disabled access to the first floor as access is by a steep flight of stone steps, with handrails. There is no lift.

12.00 – 13.00 Lunch

Have lunch in one of the historic city centre pubs. The *Red Lion* in the High street, which started life as a medieval merchant’s house, still retains its vaults and the *Duke of Wellington* in Bugle Street is built on top of 12th Century vaults.

13.15 – 14.15 The Southampton Museum of Archaeology, God’s House Tower, Platform Road, Town Quay

The museum is located in the historic God’s House Tower and displays some of the objects previously displayed at the Tudor House Museum, which at present is closed for refurbishment. There is an exciting temporary exhibition programme and the museum has an interactive computer from which visitors can access the Archaeological Collections Database and a CD-Rom about Medieval Southampton. In the museum can be seen a fascinating model of Southampton Old Town depicting the town as it would have appeared in 1620. Please note that there is wheelchair access to the foyer only and that to reach the exhibition areas there are flights of stairs but no lift.

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14.30 – 15.30 Maritime Museum, corner of Bugle Street/Town Quay Road.

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Built originally as a warehouse for the medieval wool trade, the museum now depicts the story of the Port of Southampton and the great liners that sailed from the city to all parts of the world. On the first floor is an exhibition telling the story of the "Titanic" and how the loss of the ship had such an impact on the people of Southampton.
