

## **Waterfront Trail**

### **10.00 – 10.30 Mayflower Park**

This public park overlooking Southampton Water is the closest point on land to see the world's majestic ships in the city's Western Docks and visitors can sit or stroll by this vibrant waterfront. ### **Suggested Excursion**

Enjoy a 12 minute trip across to historic Hythe on the other side of Southampton Water using the charm of the Hythe Ferry enabling you to view Southampton from the water. The ferry passes close to the Queen Elizabeth II Cruise Terminal. ### **10.30 – 11.30 Maritime Museum, corner Bugle Street/Town Quay Road**

Built originally as a warehouse for the medieval wool trade, the museum now depicts the story of the Port of Southampton and the great liners that sailed from the city to all parts of the world. On the first floor is an exhibition telling the story of the "Titanic" and how the loss of the ship had such an impact on the people of Southampton.

Please note that there is a wheelchair access only to the ground floor exhibitions. The first floor and Titanic exhibition can only be reached by flights of stairs and there is no lift.

Admission Charges apply: Adult £2; over 60s £1; 7-16 years, student, unwaged £1; under 7s free; family ticket (2 adult and 3 children) £5

It is another ideal viewing area to enjoy at your leisure ships passing through the port and from the end of Town Quay can be seen the QM2 Cruise Terminal in the Eastern Docks where the Queen Mary 2 berths when in Southampton. Town Quay is also a superb venue to enjoy a waterfront **lunch**.

### **14.00 – 15.00 Ocean Village**

Ocean Village has its own marina, restaurants, cafes and two cinemas and is about a 15 minute walk from the Town Quay.
